With spring upon us the Cascade Fire Department has a few reminders for everyone to keep in mind, NO outdoor burning weekdays until 3 PM, if you do burn please be courteous to your neighbors.

Warmer weather means more outdoor activities like grilling so here are a few reminders for you— 1. Keep your grill at least 3 ft away from any buildings; 2. Use your grill outdoors only; 3. Clean your grill after every use, this will prevent grease building up and catching fire; 4. If you remove charcoal from your grill be sure to put it in a metal bucket or bin if it is still hot.



On May 15th the Cascade Fire Department and First Responders will be holding an Open House at our new station from NOON – 8PM. There will be a brat fry, and live music from 4 till 8. Please come out and take a tour of our new home.

We are also moving forward with plans to hold our picnic this year so stay tuned for details.

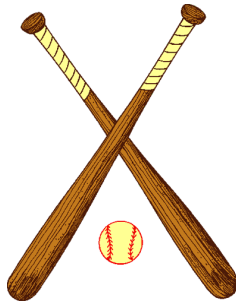

Hello Cascade Village residents! Well we are a couple months into 2021 and most of you probably agree that 2020 was a year that could be forgotten. Slowly we are starting to see things open back up and hopefully it continues throughout the year.

Please remember that dog licenses need to be paid by March 31. Any dog 5 months old or older needs to be licensed by April 1st every year, which is a Wisconsin Law and adopted by ordinance in the Village of Cascade. Visit <http://villageofcascade.org/dog-license/> for more information on how to license your dog. Also, some questions have come in about picking up after your dogs. There is an ordinance that requires dog owners to pick up after their dogs whether on their property or when they are out for a walk.

The Village is currently going through a process of updating and restructuring ordinances. One thing that is of high concern is the appearances of some properties throughout the Village. When the ordinance process is complete we will start addressing some of the pressing issues as it relates to some public nuisance yards and unlicensed/junked vehicles. We are going to be looking to clean up some yards that have lots of debris and items that are a common place for rodents to congregate and could become a public health issue.

Two new things for the Police Department. Officer Mertz started in January and his biography is in the newsletter. Secondly, the department has ordered a new squad. The 2021 Dodge Durango Pursuit is currently in production and will hopefully be on the road in the next few months. Lastly, after 3.5 years of service to the Village Officer Kyle Coulter has resigned in March.
